THE BASIL BOWES MEMORIAL CHALLENGE

TROPHY WINNER

The winner of the Basil Bowes Memorial Challenge Trophy for 1964 is Alister Cannon driving his Alvis T.A. 14. The fate of the trophy was decided by the result of the two-day Rally to San Remo on February 22nd & 23rd.

The trophy goes to the highest aggregate points scored by an Alvis in the twin events, the Observation Trial, held on the Saturday and the Gymkhana held on the Sunday. Alister scored the total of 163 points. This score was the highest of any make competing.

Individual results are tabulated below.

SAN REMO MEMORIAL RALLY - Dramatic Test of Enthusiasm!!!

In spite of the worst weather conditions experienced since the Great Flood, the two-day Rally at San Remo was contested with zest to its conclusion on the afternoon of Sunday, February 23rd.

Under a lowering sky on the Saturday morning, the competitors were sent off sporadically on the start of the observation trial section of the route. It was unfortunate that weeks of planning should have been upset by lateness of arrival of some competitors. Doubtless this will improve next year, as a feature of the conditions will be loss of points for lateness at the start.

David Wishher, although not officially competing was sent off first in the T.C. 21 Saloon. Five minutes later John MacLeod and wife, Eila sped on their way in their T.C. 21 Saloon. Keith Welsh and his family in the Mark V Jaguar, followed by Barry Gough (a lone figure) in the S.A. Speed 20, departed at intervals of five minutes each.

Des Donnan and his gallant lady (& son) braved the elements in the 12/50 Tourer, less hood, and were sent off next. Alister Cannon arrived with a screech of brakes and a shower of gravel to relate a rear wheel rubbing on the gravel, which he had been forced to cure by removing and replacing the spring. So Alister and Rosalie were sent on their way.

Sid Lehner had failed to appear over the horizon by 11.45 a.m., so somewhat my stified we departed without Sid. The reason became plain later. Sid had given the T.A. 21 Drophead to a friend (?) to repair on the Tuesday previous. Came Saturday and neither friend (?) nor car was to be found. Sid appeared during the afternoon with Roy Henderson and although carless, obviously enjoyed himself. Which shows a very good club spirit.

Simon Ramsay and Roy Henderson started during the afternoon, timing their own start, having been given a sealed envelope with trial sheets the night previous.

A welcome institution at the start from 21 Edgar Street was the Morris motorised caravan in which Nick Davies, his wife & son had journeyed up from Penshurst, near Hamilton. The shelter and the cups of tea were very much appreciated!

The Route

The route of the observation trial led through Dandenong to Berwick, then down to Koo-Wee-Rup and thence on to San Remo, with many guileful clues to be sorted out on the way.

The Storm!!!

About 4 p.m. the storm broke at San Remo, fortunately after most competitors had arrived. Andy Hannam was seen to dive across the card table to prevent it and the papers from being air-borne. Luckily a card table has not a good aerofoil section or we might have lost finishing marshall, results and all!

The Evening

It had been intended to hold a barbecue with films in the back garden of Mrs. Bowes' San Remo house, but the continuing deluge put paid to that idea.

The barbecus was successfully held indoors, however and later through the good offices of Terry Plummer & Barry Gough we saw films of various Alvis Car Club events going back four or five years. Si Ramsay showed us at least 250 slides including his own & Austin Woods' overseas slides and cars present at Berwick, Albury, Kalorama etc. to the accompaniment of a phenomenally well-catalogued commentary. A very enjoyable evening.

The members spent the night in scattered billets, some in the caravant park, some in the house.

Gymkhana.

On the Sunday morning the weather abated a little until we got to the track, when it commenced to shower intermittently with patches of sunshine between tempered by a cold wind.

In spite of this the course was quickly set out and the 7 events run through in brisk time. Intervening showers forced all to dive for cover in or behind the pits until they passed. At the conclusion of events an impromptu barbecue was held in and around the pits. Sid Lehner cheerfully volunteered to sell the meat left from the night before and happily "flogged" almost all of it.

The barbecue lunch was followed by an optional standing 1/4 mile sprint along the track over the finishing line. Fastest time was 21.4 sec. recorded by Graham Quinn (Valiant), followed by 23.6 sec. put up by Simon Ramsay (Valiant), 25.2 sec. by Alister Cannon (T.A. 14), 25.6 sec. by Keith Welsh (Jaguar Mk. V) and a lumbering 31 sec. by David Caldwell (T.A.14)

After this the Alvis cars present took part in the traditional line-up for photographs. Those duly over, the members left for home after a weekend of triumphing over the elements, which thoroughly earned each one the title of Enthusiast.

Results of Events

Des Donnan emerged a clear winner of the Observation Trial section with a score of 75 points gained in the 12/50 Tourer.

Alister Cannon totted up the highest score of points in the Gymkhana Section on the Sunday in the T.A. 14 with an award of 90 points.

The highest aggregate of points over the two sections was scored by Alister Cannon with 163 points, which being registered in an Alvis makes Alister the winner of the Basil Bowes Memorial Challenge Trophy for 1964.

In second place came Des. Donnan in the 12/50 with 144 points followed by Barry Gough with an aggregate of 137 points, Keith Welsh with 131 points, John McLeod 111 points, and Simon Ramsay with 85 points.

Handicap

The Vintage & P.V.T. vehicles received handicaps worked out as follows:-

Des Donnan's 1926 12/50 received 1 point for each year of age prior to 1939 back to 1930 and 2 points for each year prior to 1930 back to 1926, making a bonus score of 17 points for the weekend. This was added to his aggregate score in the Trial & Gymkhana.B.Gough's Spd.20 Collected a point for each year of age prior to 1939 to '32 adding 7 points. In addition the nature of the events in the Gymkhana and the short course lengths were designed to cancel out the advantage conferred by larger modern horse power and make skilful driving the criterion.

The results seem to indicate that some success was achieved in this direction,
