Dear Richard,

Eric Cunningham's diligent efforts in tracing survivors of the Marque has at last promoted my twopence worth on the TA and TB 14.75 models.

Perusal of Hull and Johnson shows that ll of the TA and l only TB were exported by the factory to Australia. However, in its listing of the survivors known in the later 50's when the book was compiled, only 2 are mentioned here, both as TB's, which implies at least one private importation. If Ken Day's original book "The Alvis Car" is correct in believing that about 50 were made (ref. p66) then it seems unlikely that there was any strong influx of private imports from such a small production. So it seems likely that the number that arrived here was from 12 to 14 cars.

This leads us to Eric's favourite topic of survivors. We believe that there are six left, plus a few odd scraps of other cars, but nothing near enough to build up another car. Could this be a vintage Alvis survival record, possibly being as high as 50%!

The attempts to trace vehicles has turned up a variety of odd information. I believe that the car that Alastair Wilkie had around 1960 is the one that Laurie Buckland has almost completed restoring. Admittedly this is not based on component numbers but that both owners obtained a car that had a central gear change butchered into it. A fairly rare conversion I should think.

In the case of my own car, it is well known as the car that Nat Italiano worked on for ten years prior to his untimely death. A more recently discovered fact is that it is the same car that John Needham used to burn off the FJ's in 1963; this being prior to it breaking down, being vandalized (including baptism in the Elwood Canal) and subsequent theft a week later. I should mention that Nat purchased the car without knowledge of its theft in 1966, but we don't know who from. Any suggestions?

The early history has been discovered up until 1940 when it was sold out of the family that purchased it new. In fact the first owner fell out of the passenger's seat and was killed in 1929. Oddly enough he was coming home from his father's funeral.

I wonder if any early members of the Club remember the car in the period from 1940 to 1959. During this time, its colour was changed to blue and then green from the original burgundy, and a form of hardtop fitted, presumably when the hood fell apart. It was quite possibly living in the Essendon area for all or part of this period. The registration number was always 151 634. Naturally, I would be very grateful for any information.

At last the restoration seems to be making headway again, with the aim of competing in the International Rally to Canberra next year. There are seven Alvis entered amongst the 900 odd vehicles, so hopefully we will stand out amongst the 47 Dodges, and countless Fords.

All bushes, shackles and so on renewed. New wiring, of course. Everything is Alvis 12/70 except for the carburettor and inlet manifold, they are TA 14. The body is a steel frame covered by marine ply and red vinyl. It is a sparse body, no doors and a small box behind the seats for overnight gear.

The car is fully registered. We built as an Alvis hillclimb special, and as my last hillclimb was at Rob Roy many years ago, it is perhaps a good thing that we sell the car! The price : \$6,750.


