## TORQUE OF TONKIN



## MT TARRENGOWER WEEK END 9th & 10th OCTOBER 1999

Sunday 10th easy driving to Mt Tarrengower for the Hill Climb. It is hoped to arrange a suitable parking area so that the cars can be displayed together. Depart Mt Tarrengower as individually required.
