TORQUE OF TONKIN

Greetings. I have just (literally, this afternoon), got back from the Kalorama Vintage Car Rally, the one-day event held at the Kalorama Reserve each March. The Club has been a supporter of the event for years – in fact, I think we were one of the foundation organisers. Anyway, this year, the Kalorama committee decided to begin a rolling, 50 year age limit (for cars, not entrants), whereas the event had previously been confined to pre-war cars. That decision was no doubt prompted by declining numbers of attendees over recent years, and a feeling that there were many interesting post-war cars that were being excluded from the event.

While the purists no doubt argued that a vintage event should be for vintage (and PVT) vehicles, I, for one, have in the past felt somewhat peeved that I had to park our TA 21 outside the white fence (until we acquired the eligible Crested Eagle), while our friends with eligible cars were inside that boundary and could, of course, compete in the various events.

Whatever the merits of the arguments on both sides – to admit or exclude post-war cars, the fact is that they are now part of the Kalorama event, and I will probably take our TA 21 Drophead next year. There were 69 entrants on this year's program, although I think there would have been another 15 or 20 cars that were not listed. Of the 69 listed, there were only 6 post-war cars, but I also saw several RM Rileys, 3 Bristols, a 1951 Ferrari (a lovely car), and others. I must say, they seemed to blend in well with the pre-war cars and I noticed that David and Lyne Vaughan's 12/50 (ex John and Kay Ball), was up against an RM Riley in one of the events (and beat it!). I also saw an RM Riley in the Slow Race and I am now testing the TA 21 Drophead, with 2 sacks of oats in the boot, to see if he might be persuaded to travel at walking pace next year.

Seen at Kalorama, apart from the Vaughans, were Barry and Verna Gough (Speed 20), Peter McAuley (Crested Eagle – yes, there are one or two other ones about), Ray Newell (12/50), Peter Fleming and John White. Many of the Club "regulars" at Kalorama were absent, no doubt because of fettling for the NSW Rally and the VSCC Alpine to Tassie. Anyway, it was a good day and let's get some more Alvisti along next year, including the TA (and B) 14s and TA 21s.

We had a successful debut of John Link's idea of "Car of the Month" at the March Club Meeting, with Geoff Hood bringing along his 12/50 Special racing car. Geoff explained, in a way that even I could understand, how he built the car, how it runs and handles. Many thanks for your time and effort, Geoff. In April, Bob Graham will be explaining the mysteries of the restoration of his Speed 20.

Well, I had better get back to polishing the Drophead for the NSW Rally – can't have those Original Alvis folk outshining us. I am taking the video camera, so there will be a Picture Show at the April Club Meeting (also featuring the Vaughan's 12/50 eventing at Kalorama), so make a point of being there. Don't forget it's on Friday, 28th April, not the third Friday of the month, because of Easter.



GREMLINS AGAIN


In ALVIC last month a set of British Stamps was attributed to Australia Post. Sorry about that. Eric Cunningham wonders why Alvis was not included, though.

RON FOGGO

was journey-man boiler maker who spent most of his working life erecting power stations in the Hunter and Latrobe Valleys. A real Alvis enthusiast and he sent me this story.

In N.S.W. one is obliged to present your car to a licensed tester once a year for examination. I think this is a good idea but when you have a car that has lost its first bloom of youth and it is not a common make, the tester pays more attention to it than usual.

I once owned a Silver Eagle Alvis that had been originally equipped with a mechanical device to dip the headlamps, this gadget had beet removed before I owned the car. Previous testers had paid no attention to my lack of headlamp dipping. To avoid dazzling oncoming cars I would switch from main lamps to parking lamps.

However, this particular tester insisted that I had to have another system and would not issue a roadworthy certificate with the present set-up.

To overcome this problem I arranged the wiring in such a way that when the lights required dipping, a switch was closed passing the current through a resistor from an old half charge unit from a motor cycle. When I presented the car again, it was passed.

This re-wiring had been completed in a hurry and the resistance unit had been left hanging down from behind the instrument panel just ahead of the passenger's front seat. When driving at night with a front seat passenger, he or she would sometimes become alarmed when on dipping the lamps, they would observe an object just in front of their right knee glowing steadily brighter until the oncoming car had passed, then the incandescent glowing coil would fade.
